In the month of September, our Generosity Offering is in support of Reality Changers. Reality Changers is a program in City Heights for youth, mostly Latino, who will be the first in their families to go to college. It recruits 8th and 9th graders who are at risk for gang involvement, and makes them a better offer: Attend a three-hour weekly tutoring and leadership development program, commit to no drugs and no gang involvement, maintain a 3.0 average, perform 50 hours of community service a year and Reality Changers guarantees college admission and scholarships. This Week in Children's Religious Education

Hillcrest Campus:

Childcare for children birth through age three is available in Room 105 during both Sunday morning services.

Children's Chapel Service: We begin our new Church School Year with a Chapel service. After they leave the Meeting House, children ages 4 through 6th Grade will join our Director of Religious Education, Liz Jones, for a service focused on what it means to Stand on the Side of Love. We will discuss the reading of the Koran that will just have happened in our Meeting House and we will see letters from the children in our Partner Church in Malingin and write letters in return.

A Reminder: Unless otherwise noted, children four years old and up begin their Sunday morning in the Meeting House with their parents. We consider the time we spend together in the Meeting House before classes begin as an integral part of the religious education program. Children should be picked up from at the chapel directly after the worship service. Children three and younger may be left in childcare before you enter the Meeting House and need to be picked up immediately after the service. South Bay Campus:
