Ministry Team Council

First UU Church is organized into "Ministry Teams," or, clusters of groups engaged in the work of the church. Today we have eight such teams; *Caring, Generosity, Larger UU Connections, Lifespan Religious Growth & Leading, Membership, Social Justice, South Bay and Worship & Program*. Each ministry team made up of the individual groups of the church, such as the *Practical Care Network, Friends of de Benneville Pines, Men's Fellowship, Earth Centered Spirituality Circle, and Young Adults 25-35*. There are about 65 of these groups that create programs and activities in support of our mission and Unitarian Universalist values. Anyone can get involved in these groups.

Each ministry team is "led" by at least one lay leader working with at least one staff person. In the past, the Ministry Team Council was made up of the lay leaders and staff who were designated "leader" of each ministry team. This Council regularly gathered to share information of what various groups were doing.

While this structure of each ministry team being "led" by lay leader and staff person will remain for accountability, planning and facilitating the new meetings, the purpose, mission and gatherings of the Ministry Team Council has been completely redefined. The new mission of the *Ministry Team Council* is to create a community of spiritually grounded leaders who inspire acting on our values to help heal the world.

Ministry Team Council meetings are held on a quarterly basis and are open to all lay leaders and interested church members. That means, ANYONE who is engaged in the many groups of the church is eligible, and welcome, to attend. The quarterly Ministry Team Council meetings will focus on interesting, important and supportive in-service trainings. Through these gatherings, we will better be able to identify potential leaders while encouraging and developing current lay leaders.

The Ministry Team Council shall accomplish its mission through :

1. Conducting relevant meetings as needed; budget, calendar, communications, strategic plans & training
2. Identifying, encouraging and developing lay leaders
3. Providing lay leaders and church groups with opportunities for on-going dialogues regarding spiritual development, reflection and awareness, taking time to periodically define these words.
4. Assuring that each ministry team is aligned to the church mission and outcomes
5. Practicing a culture of appreciation

Ministry Team Council meetings shall:

1. Be convened on a quarterly basis, open to all church groups and lay leaders and facilitated by Ministry Team Leadership (the lay leader and staff team accountable to each Ministry Team.)
2. Have regular, concise and appropriate agendas
3. Produce minutes in a timely manner and sent out to all lay leaders
4. Regularly recognize and appreciate volunteers
5. Produce action items to carry forth our work into the world, and to hold us accountable
6. Present ongoing leadership training
7. Support ongoing spiritual development, reflection and awareness
8. Facilitate regular checking in on goals from the strategic plan

- Lay Ministers

Trained church members work alongside the professional ministers in caring for members who are experiencing significant losses or life transitions, or have other needs. Provides Sunday caring listening presence.

- Practical Care Network

Provide services to church members in need, such as rides to church or medical appointments, and errands and chores for the homebound. Provides phone outreach and loans medical equipment.

- Expanded Lay Ministry (ELMS) ???

A group of lay leaders in the Caring team who provide Super Cards for members, make phone calls to members and friends offering support and information, and other ways of connecting members and friends together.

- Pastoral Care Advisory Group (PCAG) ???

An oversight committee that creates policy need for the ministry team and keeps the congregation informed about Care Team information.

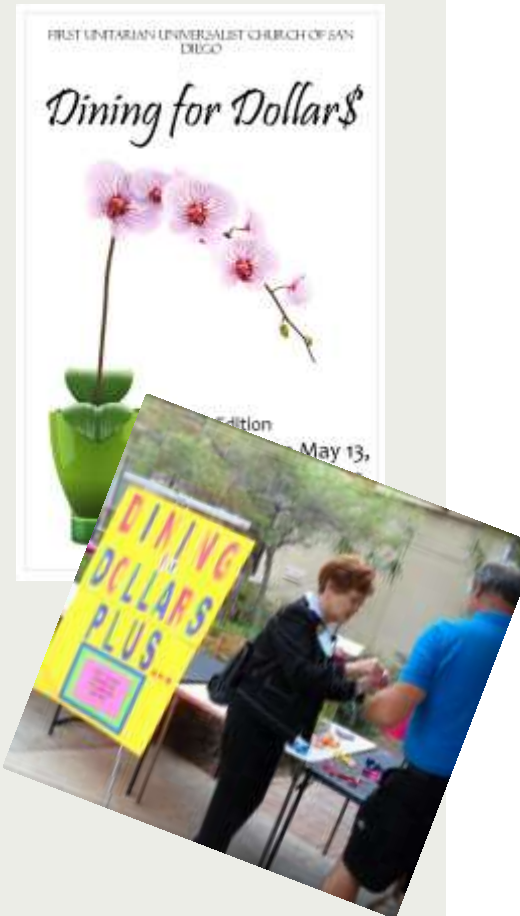
The church's endowment to help ensure a strong liberal religious program for our future.

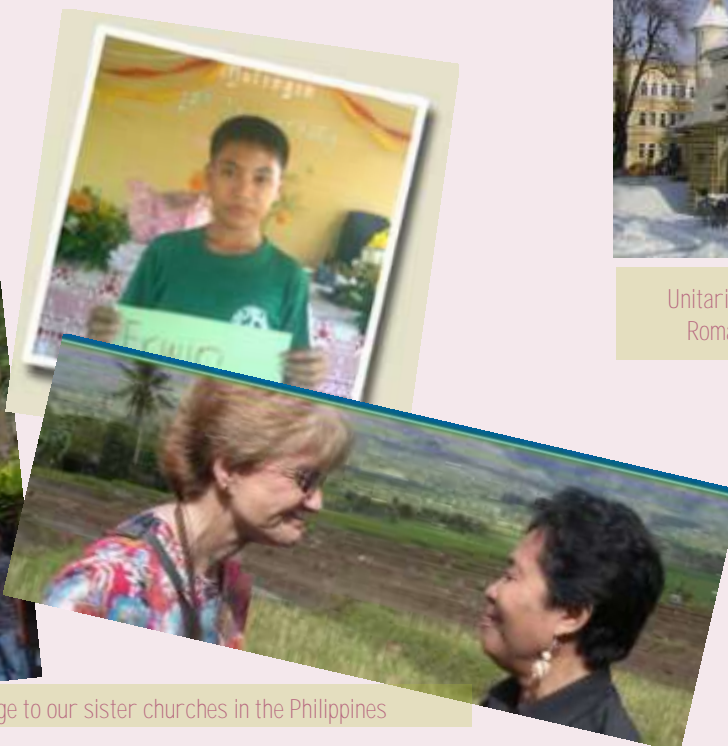

- **Adult Religious Growth & Learning**

The purpose of the Adult Religious Education Growth and Learning Program is to nurture and stimulate the religious and personal growth of the adult church community and the community at large by offering a varied and cohesive program within the context of the larger Unitarian Universalist tradition and religious community.

- **Archives**

The archives are devoted to preserving the church history in text, sound, and graphic forms.

- **Children's Ministry**

Programs to nurture and stimulate our children's spiritual and personal growth and to teach and model the values that hold us together as Unitarian Universalists.

- **Family Ministry**

Dedicated to creating and nurturing programs that will support our families and help them thrive.

- **All Church Camp (subgroup of Family Ministry)**

Sponsors an annual all church, intergenerational weekend retreat filled with workshops, entertainment, socializing, support, and a worship service.

- **Leadership Development**

Promotes learning and leadership skills of individuals and committees, assists with organizational development issues, and recruits leadership school candidates.

- **Library**

Maintains a lending library of books and related material on UUism and general theological issues and other topics of concern to current groups within the church.

- **Neighborhood Groups**

Gatherings of people who live in common areas who meet in social gathering for support and fellowship.

- **Unitarian Cooperative Preschool**

An on-site school with child oriented activities which encourage the development of whole children.

- **Wisdom Circles (formerly Spiritual Friendship Groups, Covenant Groups)**

Small groups of people who meet regularly for topic-driven, facilitated sharing which brings opportunities for deep and meaningful connections (formerly known as Covenant Groups and Spiritual Friendship Groups.)

- **Youth Programming**

A working group of both Adults and Youth who work to support the Youth Programs of the church and assist in bringing the youth into meaningful relationship with the larger church community.

- Hospitality

Hosts the Welcome Table on Sunday mornings, visitor orientation sessions and provides Sunday morning docent tours, greeters, nametags, and visitor follow-up.

- Kitchen

Maintains and coordinates two highly used kitchens. Manages the Sunday social hour after each service.

- Membership

Helping people become members of this church and find a place within the community.

- **Men's Fellowship (UUMF)**

Personal support, intellectual stimulation, creative growth, spiritual deepening and social outreach to the men of the church and community.

- Singletarians

Social opportunities for single persons over 50, including brunch after church at a local restaurant and occasional gatherings hosted at members' homes

- **UU Women (formerly Women's Federation)**

Enables church women to join together for mutual support, personal growth, and spiritual enrichment via monthly programs, discussion groups, and special events.

- Voluntary Simplicity

Supports people in living simpler lives more in line with what is important to them, being intentional about the way they spend their time, energy, and money and taking care of the planet.

- Women Together (annual retreat)

Sponsors an annual empowering women's weekend retreat filled with workshops, entertainment, socializing, support, and a worship service.

- Young Adult and Campus Ministry

- Young Adults 18 to 24

Young people between the ages of 18 and 24 get together weekly to discuss political, social, spiritual and personal issues that affect our age group. Tuesday nights 7 to 9 pm.

- Young Adults 25 to 35

Gatherings and activities for young adults ages 25 to 35, age related experiences are processed, shared and explored.

- Campus Ministry

- **Caring Council**
Supports the work of the San Diego Caring Council in a variety of ways with one of our social justice leaders serving on the Caring Council's Board. Focus on access to the food stamp program for those in need.
- **Generosity Offerings**
Organizes disposition of Generosity Offerings. Each Sunday, at both campuses, we give away 85% of our morning collection to local organizations whose work reflect our values.
- **Interfaith Committee for Worker Justice**
Supports one of our community partners whose works in a variety of ways including generosity offerings, rallies, meetings and more.
- **Monthly Service Projects**
Organizes family-friendly projects are usually held on Saturday mornings at various organizations in central and southern San Diego county. Watch the Window for information about up-coming projects.
- **Organizing for Justice (SDOP – San Diego Organizing Project)**

- **Caregiving**
The South Bay Caregivers Network supports the caregiving needs of our members & friends. Services we may provide include: rides to church or medical appointments, emergency meals, etc.
- **Growth & Outreach**
Working with the Membership & Social Justice working groups, the Growth & Outreach working group creates activities to support the First Unitarian Universalist Church of the South Bay. The goals of the committee include: increasing Unitarian Universalist visibility in the community, collaborating with diverse South Bay Organizations, and encouraging community involvement.
- **Membership & Hospitality**
To maintain a vital & growing congregation it is important to fulfill our mission through connections to members & visitors. Whether it be monthly potlucks, social hour, get involved activities or the Welcome Table, everyone is welcome & encouraged to participate in our church life.
- **Spiritual Growth & Religious Education**
Children's Religious Education is held on Sunday mornings. Each Sunday, children ages 4 to 12 worship with their families for the first part of service. Most Sundays, the children move to their classroom for programming specifically designed to foster Unitarian Universalist identity and values. Adult religious education is scheduled at various times during the week.

Spiritual growth is also supported by small group ministry. A 12 Steps to a Compassionate Life group holds monthly meetings and other small groups are in the planning stages. There is also a neighborhood group meeting every other month.

• **Worship & Music**

The South Bay Campus worships together each Sunday morning at 10 am. Our services are bi-lingual, with simultaneous translation from English to Spanish. Several Sundays a month, our Lead or Associate Ministers preach live, often followed by a coffee conversation on the topic of the sermon. On the other Sundays, our worship is led by staff and lay leaders, and the sermon is experienced through a video.

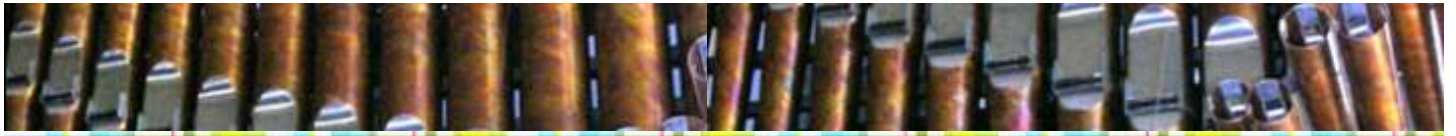

- Art Guild
Brings beauty and culture to church members and grounds in the form of diverse art, art shows, and artist discussion groups.
- Buddhist Sangha
A teaching, learning, and sharing spiritual community of Buddhist study and practice.
- Choirs
 - Chalice*
Performs three times a month at Sunday Services and leads festival services with instrumental ensembles twice a year.
 - JUUL Tones*
An auditioned, a-cappella vocal ensemble, singing a wide variety of styles of choral music. In addition to community, social-justice-related, and outreach performances, the ensemble sings monthly for Sunday worship.
- **Women's Ensemble**
This ensemble rehearses weekly to perform four-part sacred and secular music for treble voices in worship and community outreach. Director Lynn Mendoza-Khan stresses a healthy vocal technique for singers of all ages.
- *Handbells*
 - *UUBellation Handbells*—Our entry-level ensemble of adults that rings three-octave sets of hand bells and hand chimes. It offer musical beauty to our Sunday worship and does community outreach.
 - *Las Campanas Handbell Ensemble*—Our advanced musical ensemble of adults that rings three-octave sets of handbells and hand chimes. It offers musical beauty to our Sunday worship and does community outreach.
- **Children's Choir**
A basic music-learning experience for children ages 4½ to 9 based on music from many world traditions. Age-appropriate vocal technique is taught, and this group sings several times throughout the church year.
- *Voices in Unity*
Junior and senior high youth learn four-part music, theory, and vocal training. They perform monthly during Sunday services.
- Communications Action Group
Monitors and reviews internal and external church communication.
- Christian Study Group
Offers an alternative to the Christian right: you can be a UU and a Christian too! Weekly worship service with communion is offered
- Earth Centered Spirituality Circle
Holds ritual worship, drumming, prayer circles, labyrinth walking, and pagan classes. Families welcome.
- Flowers
Coordinates flowers for Sunday worship. Sign up for donating flowers through the coordinator.
- Helen Meyers Forum
Arranges and publicizes special church programs "for the purpose of providing for lectures and sermons by outstanding Unitarian Ministers and lay people, by meeting transportation costs, fees and expense needs thereof."
- Humanist Discussion Group
Holds regular discussion and study groups and promotes humanism as common ground among all people of good will.
- Looking Glass Theatre
A multi-generational theatrical production company dedicated to presenting theater that reflects UU beliefs and values.
- Meditation
Open, ongoing meetings to learn and practice seated, standing, and walking meditation.
- Memorial Wall
A memorial sculpture in which tiles carry the individual name and dates of birth and death.
- Nominating
This committee helps find eligible leaders to serve on the Board and Committees
- Ushering
Provides ushers for Sunday services and monitors and prepares Meeting House supplies.

There are seven principles which Unitarian Universalist congregations affirm and promote:

- ◆ The inherent worth and dignity of every person;
- ◆ Justice, equity and compassion in human relations;
- ◆ Acceptance of one another and encouragement to spiritual growth in our congregations;
- ◆ A free and responsible search for truth and meaning;
- ◆ The right of conscience and the use of the democratic process within our congregations and in society at large;
- ◆ The goal of world community with peace, liberty, and justice for all;
- ◆ Respect for the interdependent web of all existence of which we are a part.

Unitarian Universalism (UU) draws from many sources:

- ◆ Direct experience of that transcending mystery and wonder, affirmed in all cultures, which moves us to a renewal of the spirit and an openness to the forces which create and uphold life;
- Words and deeds of prophetic women and men which challenge us to confront powers and structures of evil with justice, compassion, and the transforming power of love;
- Wisdom from the world's religions which inspires us in our ethical and spiritual life;
- Jewish and Christian teachings which call us to respond to God's love by loving our neighbors as ourselves;
- Humanist teachings which counsel us to heed the guidance of reason and the results of science, and warn us against idolatries of the mind and spirit;
- Spiritual teachings of earth-centered traditions which celebrate the sacred circle of life and instruct us to live in harmony with the rhythms of nature.

These principles and sources of faith are the backbone of our religious community.

Mission Statement

Outcome Statements

- ◆ We welcome and support our members, friends, and visitors on their spiritual paths.
- ◆ We embrace diversity, see differences as opportunities for growth, and value all people for the ways they enrich our community.
- ◆ We support and encourage families of all configurations, and we nurture our children and youth.
- ◆ We understand our Unitarian Universalist identity, and we embody Unitarian Universalist principles.
- ◆ We are compassionate, and we care for and support one another in times of joy and sorrow.

We nurture spiritual growth:

- ◆ We worship together in ways that comfort and challenge us, and we work and learn together to develop our hearts and minds.
- ◆ We give generously of our time, resources, and talents.
- ◆ We share in ministry and develop our leadership abilities in order to enrich our lives and the lives of others.
- ◆ We create an environment in which people feel safe to grow and change.

We act on our values to help heal the world:

- ◆ We identify and challenge oppression and injustice for all beings.
- ◆ We model environmental sustainability.
- ◆ We partner with other faith communities and organizations in support of shared values.
- ◆ We proclaim the transformative power of our faith.





Covenant of Good Relations

Preamble: We members, friends, staff, and ministers of First Unitarian Universalist Church of San Diego covenant to treat ourselves and one another with respect.

We vow to live our values, to learn, and to serve in ways that are fulfilling and responsible.

We respect and honor ourselves and others when we:

- ◆ listen, speak, and act with integrity and compassion;
- ◆ communicate openly without anonymous criticism; and
- ◆ express gratitude and appreciation.

We value ourselves and others when we:

- ◆ invite and welcome into our church the diverse populations and cultures of the wider community;
- ◆ enjoy each other with playfulness and good humor; and
- ◆ act with awareness of ecological issues.

We learn when we:

- ◆ educate ourselves about church structure and governance, and the responsibilities of ministers, staff, and volunteers;
- ◆ appreciate our own limitations as well as those of others; and
- ◆ practice the established process of resolving differences.

We serve when we:

- ◆ contribute our financial resources, time, and skills according to our ability whenever possible;
- ◆ model Unitarian Universalist beliefs and values; and
- ◆ strive to reflect more accurately the demographics of the wider community in our church.
