Join Jorge Gonzalez, the Afro-Mexican program ambassador at the Worldbeat Cultural Center, for a stimulating discussion on the presence and history of people of African descent in Mexico. For the past 500 years, Afro-Mexicans have been omitted from Mexican history, governmental rights, and society. According to the 2020 census, which was the first time the country's Black population was officially 2,576,213 self-identified recognized, there are Afro-descendants. #### **Climate Justice: Power Hungry AI**

Artificial Intelligence (AI) is an immensely power-hungry technology that uses specialized microchips to process mountains of data. Electricity consumption at US data centers is projected to triple from 2022 levels. To meet this surge in demand, some utilities plan to delay closing coal fired power plants or build new gas-powered ones, leading to greater emissions. New data centers put more pressure on our stressed electrical grid that needs building up to carry more renewable energy from wind and solar.
