From Your Reopening Team In-Person Outdoor Worship Services Begin Sunday, Oct. 3

Our church's Interim Committee (Exec) recently decided to acquire large, side-less shade covers to accommodate outdoor worship services on our campus. Your Reopening Team agrees that this can work, starting Sunday Oct. 3. Well-fitting masks (the best are N95 or KN95) will be required at all times. Distancing must be observed between household clusters. Sorry, no hugs or hug-signaling bracelets. No social hour or patio tables. Bathroom use will be limited to one person at a time. And pre-registration (or on-site signing in for those who don't pre-register) will be required for all who attend. Attendance is limited to 150.

Religious Education Changes

We're adapting our RE Programs as we open up again for in-person, outdoor worship on Sunday, October 3. We **will not** be having Children's RE online on Saturdays. Rather, we'll be having RE on Sunday mornings during our 9:30 am Hillcrest Service. Families with young children should start out in the service which will be outdoors on the Patio. After the Time for All Ages, children will be dismissed to one of the Preschool Outdoor Play areas.


Beware of More Scams!
