In 1961, at the age of 13, Hezekiah Watkins rode his bicycle down to the Jackson, Mississippi Greyhound Bus Station to witness the arrival of the Freedom Riders, a racially-mixed group of U.S. citizens advocating for equal rights for African Americans. On that Sunday afternoon, his life changed forever when he was pushed into the "Whites Only" section of the terminal, arrested for allegedly being part of the Freedom Riders, and sent to the Mississippi State Penitentiary where - as a minor - he was placed on Death Row.

Come spend an evening with Mr. Watkins and hear how his arrest - the first of over the 100 that would follow - "pushed" him into a life dedicated to the struggle for justice, equality and human rights.
